
We now have 2 caravans of bikes. The first, with Mr Steve, will leave at 8.10am from Beban Park (meet outside the kindergarten between 8am and 8.10am). We will take the E & N route to the school. There are three other stations where you can join us on the route.

For the second caravan, Mrs Nathalie will welcome parents and students from 8.10am at the corner of Holly Avenue and Eberts Street on Wednesdays and Fridays. The departure on the cycle track will be at 8.20am.

This caravan is for the morning only. Parents should plan to pick up their child and bike in the afternoon and advise the office that you are coming by bike and cancel the bus for that day.

Parents should accompany their child on the journey or simply drop them off at one of the stations, while waiting for the caravan to arrive.

Upcoming activities at the École Océane

All students of École Océane will go on à trip to Newcastle Island in June 7. The plan of this day is to walk in the fresh air, visit the island, learn about its history and learn more about nature. Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade students will go by bus. <u>Please complete the form above.</u>

All students of École Océane will be able to participate in the carnival that will be at École Océane on **June 24th**. Many activities are planned, it will be a very exciting day! More details will be announced soon.

K/1 and 1/2: Students will go by bus on **June 22** to visit the Nanaimo Museum. On this day, students will learn about personal, cultural and positive identity.

4/5: Ms. Frances' class will take a bus trip on **June 16th** to Bowser to visit VIU Deep Bay Marine Field Station. On this trip they will learn more about the shoreline and the dangers of plastic.

6/7: Mr. Ben's class will take a bus trip on **June 15th** to Victoria to visit the Royal Museum, watch a movie at the IMAX and visit the Pocket Gallery.

School trip form - Visit to Newcastle Island (Saysutshun)

On Tuesday, June 7, our school will have an end of the year trip to Newcastle Island (Saysutshun).

This island is opposite our school and we see it every day. It has a very rich history, especially for the Snuneymuxw First Nations. Activities are planned by the educational team to make this experience memorable for the students.

Transportation from the school will be as follows:

- At 8:50 a.m., K/1e and 1/2e classes will take the bus to Maffeo Sutton Park.
- At the same time, the 3/4th, 4th/5th and 6th/7th grade students will walk from the school to Maffeo Sutton Park via the waterfront trail. This walk should take us between 30 and 45 minutes.



We have the 9:30, 10:00 and 10:30 ferries reserved to take our students to the island. The K/1 and 1/2 classes will take the first ferry and the other classes will take the following ones. 40 people at a time can go on the ferries.

At Maffeo Sutton Park, students will enjoy the playground and beach.

The return to school will be as follows:

- We will take the 12:45, 1:15 and 2:15 ferries back to Maffeo Sutton Park. The K/1 and 1/2 classes will take the first ferry and the other classes will take the following ones.
- The return to school will be by bus for all students, where at 2:40 pm, two buses will bring the students back to Océane from Maffeo Sutton Park.

We therefore need your consent for this outing (one form submission per child attending the school).

We will also need 6 parent volunteers to accompany us (a maximum of 120 people (40x3)). We will contact you by email or phone <u>if needed</u> for parents who are available. Thank you for your involvement!

We are pleased to inform you that registration for the 2022-2023 year is now open for our school-based daycare centre Les étoiles de mer!

Both the preschool (30 months - 5 years) and school age (kindergarten - 12 years) childcare providers will be delighted to welcome your child(ren) into the program. Places are available, so please pre-register your child(ren) via our online forms below:

The pre-school daycare is open every day, **Monday to Friday, from 8.30am to 5.30pm**. The school care service currently takes care of children from the end of school until 5.30 p.m. on days when there is school. If there is interest in having the centre open before school, we are considering new hours for the 2022-2023 school year.
